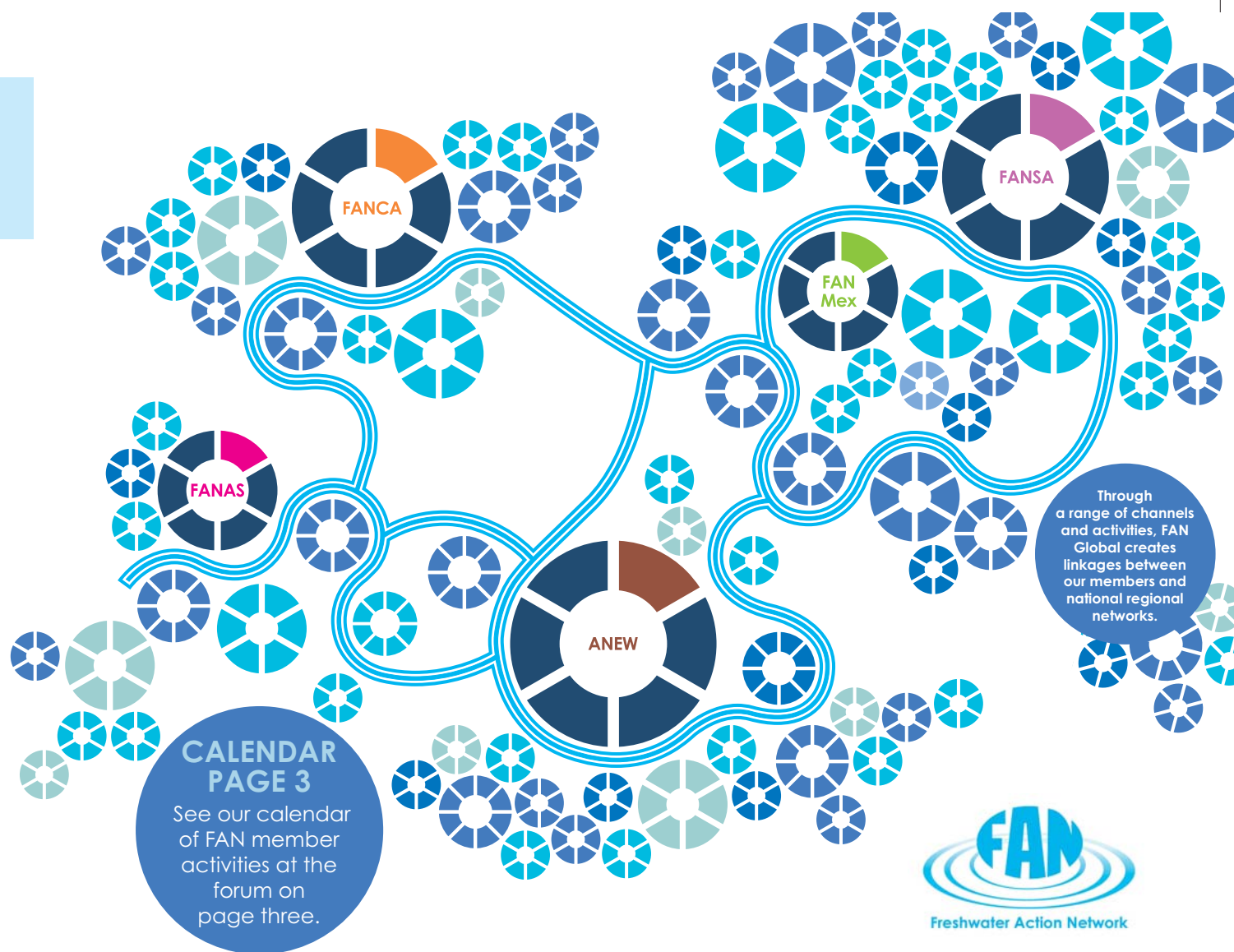
AT THE 6TH WORLD WATER FORUM

Freshwater Action Network (FAN Global) is a consortium of five regional networks of civil society organizations across South Asia, Africa and the Americas.

FAN Global works to improve water governance by **strengthening the role of civil society in decision making** at national, regional and global levels, linking the environmental and developmental agendas, for the realisation of the human rights to water and sanitation for present and future generations.

A NEWLY INDEPENDENT NETWORK

In 2011, we celebrated our first decade. In just 10 years, we have built a strong and vibrant movement of people, working together to improve water and sanitation policy for the most vulnerable and for our environment. Throughout this time, our host, WaterAid, has provided invaluable support. In July 2012, FAN Global will become a fully independent organization registered as a charity in the UK and governed by an international Board of Trustees appointed by our regional network members.

FAN GLOBAL THEMATIC PRIORITIES 2012-2015

FAN members work with poor and marginalized communities to secure access to safe water and sanitation through rights based approaches and governance advocacy. Through their work, they have gained a wealth of experience to inform and contribute to policy developments at the global and national level.

IMPLEMENTING THE HUMAN RIGHTS TO WATER AND SANITATION

We believe in the rights to safe water and sanitation for all. We supported the UN process that achieved recognition of the human rights to safe water and sanitation in 2010 in international law. We now focus on accelerating progress at the national level and are working with our members to campaign for ten countries to develop human rights based national roadmaps for the implementation of the human rights to water and sanitation by 2015. Government national action plans should be accompanied by a clear strategic framework, protected by national legislation and empowered with a set of binding guidelines that ensures central government, local authorities and private operators are accountable to the communities they serve.

Implementing these rights requires the participation of individuals in the decisions that affect their lives. FAN members inform communities about their rights and provide them with the resources and tools to make their voices count at the local and national levels.

CLIMATE CHANGE AND WATER RESOURCE MANAGEMENT

Water is critical to climate change adaptation and mitigation strategies. However, until recently, water has been absent from international climate change negotiations. FAN Global is a member of the Water and Climate Coalition (WCC). Together, we successfully advocated for the discussion of water within the UNFCCC in 2010/11. This is just the beginning. FAN Global looks forward to working with other water experts to ensure that water resources and WASH (water, sanitation and hygiene) are included in high level planning and financing decisions for adaptation and mitigation of climate change.

At the national level, FAN Global members have committed to ensuring that five countries include community-based adaptation approaches to water resources in their national plans.

A human rights approach to water and climate change seeks, at a minimum, to ensure the active, free and meaningful participation of all affected groups in connection with decisions that affect them.

FINANCING FOR WATER AND SANITATION

FAN Global is working closely on global financing campaigns with partners including End Water Poverty (EWP) and the Water Supply and Sanitation Collaborative Council (WSSCC) to advocate for 20 government-led credible national plans to be developed through participatory and transparent processes by 2015. FAN regional networks support national civil society platforms to actively engage in the Sanitation and Water for All (SWA) partnership and to advocate for more and better financing on behalf of poor and marginalized communities.

Over 50 FAN members have come to the 6th World Water Forum to share their solutions and experiences around these areas of work in sessions, side events, panels and the 'Village for Solutions' throughout the week. Come and hear first-hand how southern civil society are transforming the way in which water and sanitation are managed, accessed and respected.
